



# Project Impact Report

The Kicuzi Project signifies the beginning of the end of our *three-year journey* in this region. When complete, **over 16,000 people** will have access to the life-giving gift of clean water, latrines at their schools and some of the best hygiene and sanitation training in the world!

## PHASE 1 PROGRESS

- 29 taps were turned on to serve over 11,000 over the next 20 years.
- All 6 villages achieved national government certification for improved WASH standards.
- 94% of households have a tap stand within 500 meters of their door.
- Waterborne disease was reduced by 17%. This will be measured again at the end of the Kicuzi project.

## PHASE 2a PROGRESS

- 4 taps have been turned on
- 502 households in 3 villages have been triggered with Participatory Hygiene And Sanitation Transformation (PHAST).
- PHAST is happening in 2 primary schools including 967 students.
- 2 latrine blocks have been completed at the Muture Primary School reducing the student-to-stance ratio from 125 : 1 to 44:1 for boys, and from 154:1 to 47:1 for girls.
- Increase by 216% in the number of households practicing handwashing. Before our program only 8.54% of households were practicing handwashing. To date, we have seen that increase to 27%.
- 10 soap making workshops were conducted.
- Clients (beneficiaries) gave a 4 out 5 on the Star Rating for satisfaction of services provided by ACTS.
